DDC SUPPORTS NAVAJO NATION USNS NAVAJO (T-ATS-6) KEEL LAYING CEREMONY

On March 12, 2019, the U.S. Secretary of the Navy, Richard V. Spencer, announced the name of the newest class of Towing, Salvage and Rescue ships, Navajo, in honor of the Navajo people's contributions to the U.S. Armed

Forces. DDC actively supported the Navajo Nation's participation in the Navy Program Executive Office, Ships' joining of the first major modules of the USNS Navajo (T-ATS 6). Known as the Keel Laying Ceremony, this celebration marked the start of the ship's life, October 30, 2019 in Houma, LA. Partnered with CompQSoft, NOVA was awarded a subcontract in support of the DISA Business Development Center (BDM) Mission Partner Engagement Office (MPEO) contract. NOVA Prime Awarded NSA Contract

NOVA recently won a subcontract with Minerva Engineering in support of the National Security Agency (NSA). As a strategic partner, NOVA will support the task order under the NSETS III contract vehicle. NSETS III is NSA's primary IDIQ vehicle for en-gaging the small business community for business, engineering, IT, operations support, and training services. As part of this program, NOVA will provide technical support services in engineering, software development, and cybersecurity analysis to support the objectives of the NSA Cryptographic Solutions Program.

In the coming months, we anticipate an award through our joint venture, Diné Grey & Pape. This award would represent the first award for the partnership and first of its kind for the DDC organization. BRIC's developing capabilities and successful past performance position the team for growth during the remainder of calendar year. USACE ALBUQUERQUE DISTRICT CONTRACT AWARD

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Albuquerque District awarded BRIC the Historic Building Cultural Mitigation Services contract to provide environmental services in support of the construction of a new Air Force Research Lab Advanced High-Powered Electromagnetic Laboratory at Kirtland Air Force Base. Several existing facilities at the project site are proposed to be demolished or divested. BRIC will provide historic mitigation and conduct Historic American Building Surveys and Historic Engineering Record Surveys to support the New Mexico State Historic Preservation Office.

BRIC Receives USFS McKenzie Ranger District Award

BRIC was awarded the U.S. Forest Service (UFS) Professional Landscape Architect Services Campground and Trailhead Redesign contract to redesign the existing campground and trailhead facility in McKenzie Ranger District, North Dakota. Under this contract, our team will expand amenities and functionalities for RV and tent campers and equestrian and mountain bike trail riders.

BRIC Awarded Pueblo Grade Control Environmental Compliance Contract

The Bureau of Reclamation awarded BRIC the Zia Pueblo Grade Control Environmental Compliance contract. BRIC will support the Bureau of Reclamation in its effort to replace the original irrigation diversion structure on the Jemez River with a grade control structure. The grade control structure will ensure the upstream diversion structure, the sole source of irrigation water for the Pueblo's agricultural lands, is not jeopardized from erosion and head-cutting of the Jemez River. In the performance of this contract, BRIC will prepare an environmental assessment and perform surveys for compliance with the Clean Water Act as well as perform other natural and cultural resource surveys.

BIA Awards BIA Historical Assessment Contract

BRIC received the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) Ft. Wingate Historical Assessment contract to perform historical assessments and on-site archaeological support services on the Wingate Elementary School campus on the Navaio Nation. BRIC also prepares to create a film to document the history of the school campus. The school is located in the small settlement of Fort Wingate, NM, east of the former Fort Wingate Army Depot. The BIA proposes to demolish unsafe buildings within a 15- acre range of the school site complex, which is comprised of 42 vacant buildings.



BACA-THOREAU WATERLINE CONTRACT AWARD

Souder Miller and Associates has awarded BRIC with an Avian Survey for Baca-Thoreau contract. Under this contract, BRIC wildlife biologists will conduct avian monitoring surveys and prepare an avian monitoring report for a waterline project on the Navajo Nation.

BRIC ATTENDS DOE NEW MEXICO SMALL BUSINESS EXPO

In August, BRIC attended the DOE Small Business Expo in Albuquerque, NM. The team met with and further developed engagements with potential clients and partners, including Sandia National Laboratories. BRIC also gained important updates on DOE business opportunities and procurement strategies.

As the newly appointed DDC 4C President, I am honored that the DDC leadership team has selected me to lead DDC 4C into the future.
